Eggnog Bread Pudding

Makes 8 servings, total time: 45 minutes + resting

PLUMP:

1/4 cup dried cherries 1/4 cup brandy, hot

TOSS:

4 large all butter croissants, cubed and staled (18oz)

1/2 cup sliced almonds, toasted

1 recipe Classic Eggnog

1/4 cup sugar

1/2 tsp. freshly grated nutmeg

COAT an 8x8 inch baking dish with nonstick spray

PLUMP Cherries in brandy, 5-10 minutes.


TOSS together croissants, cherries with brandy, almonds, eggnog, sugar, and nutmeg; transfer to prepared baking dish. Cover pudding with plastic wrap, pressing down to help croissants absorb eggnog; chill overnight.

PREHEAT oven to 350 degree and remove plastic wrap before baking.

COVER pudding with foil, place on a baking sheet, and bake 30 minutes. Remove foil and bake pudding until golden, 40 minutes; let rest 15 minutes before serving.

Per serving: 670 cal; 43g total fat (23g sat); 266mg chol; 264mg sodium; 55g carb; 4g fiber; 11g protein





To prevent the eggs from curdling, temper the yolk mixture, drizzling in the hot cream while whisking.



As soon as the eggnog reaches 160 degrees, pour it into a bowl set in ice water to cool it quickly.

Vesicular Stomatitis Update

Earlier this year, I wrote a short article regarding vesicular stomatitis and the outbreak in California. VS has continued to spread throughout the summer and fall. It has now been found in California, Nevada, and Texas. As of the end of October, there were quarantines for suspected or confirmed VS in Mariposa, Madera, Fresno, Tuolumne and Tulare counties. This means that it is right in our backyard. Now, more than ever, make sure you check your horses over. Make use of fly protective gear and repellent. If you take your horse into an area that has VS, make sure to isolate that horse away from your herd for 10-14 days when you get home. Quarantine them and call a veterinarian if you see any blisters or ulcerations on your horse's tongue, lips, or gums.

The cold weather should soon kill off the insects that are a major factor in spread of the disease. In the meantime, please be aware that many states have restrictions on travel of horses coming from California. If you plan to go out of state, you may need a health certificate for your horse within 7-14 days before entering that state. Plan your travel accordingly.









Win This Amazing Bronze Sculpture


