



Dutch Oven Cooks Wanted for Polar Plunge Event



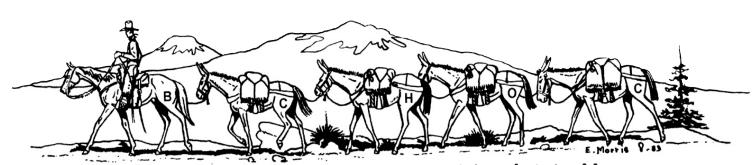
