



THE 2025 MODESTO JC INTERSCHOLASTIC TEAM

On May 8, 2025 the new and inexperienced Modesto JC pack team was up at 3:00 a.m. getting ready to travel to Cal Poly for a preview of what Bishop Mule Days will have entailed for them. Only three of the team members could participate, as Ann Sleight had to work. Our new team members are: Alana Black, Hunter Blacksmith and Jesse Freitas.

When we arrived at the Cal Poly horse unit there were students busy as bees getting all the necessary equipment ready. Animals were saddled with pack saddles and lead up to the arena. Horses were groomed and tied along the rails. Iron mules were unloaded from the Fresno team and placed in the pavilion. People were bringing all the different equipment that the teams were going to strategically load on the mules. The mules were from the Rock Creek pack stock. I knew the mules were extra calm, so I asked where they came from. It was a mutual trade between Craig London and Cal Poly. There were seven teams competing this time. Besides Modesto JC, Cal Poly, Fresno and Reedley had two teams each. After a short orientation, the individual competition started. Our team was in a different world. I told them to watch the other kids and try to follow their lead. The judge was very prompt on the starting call. Our kids were just standing there when his voice rang out. I coached them as much as I could

they were shaking in their boots. We broke for lunch for a short while, then John Ready gave the students an introduction to Bishop Mule Days. He spoke about all the activities such as camping, meals and the expectations of the competitors as role models for the Mule Association. He said sportsmanship and camaraderie play an important role in this competition too.

to help them get started and correct them as they created their box hitches. All of them had clean loads, which is our ultimate goal. Cal Poly had three different divisions. They were 4H mixed, beginner and

advanced. That was an excellent way to start our kids. They didn't appear to be very nervous, but I believe

In the afternoon the team competition started. We picked up a Fresno team member who is actually from Ceres but attending Fresno State. We were very lucky not to be the first competitors, so our kids could again scan what the other kids were undertaking. The competition included a pack and load every time they competed, which was a super exercise for our beginners. They had a scramble where our kids had to run down the arena, grab the horse and mules and walk the mules back to the load. Then they saddled and loaded the mules and walked them to the finish line. The next event was a trail course where the rider of the horse and the loaded mules had to go through and be judged on time. It was pretty difficult as they were stepping over poles, weaving through a serpentine of poles, getting off the horse and opening the gate and remounting, traveling through a walkway of close put-together poles and finally entering in a keyhole circle and leaving without touching anything. Alana Black is our horse rider and she was complemented on a job well done. It was a tough job but Alana successfully accomplished it. The final event was in a different capacity. It was called a pack and unload. They were judged on everything including the proper way to place all of the equipment on a Mantee after they reached the destination of their make believe clients. The experience our team received from this event will not be replicated any time soon. The day ended at 4:30 p.m. and we headed for home. This was an endurance test for all of us and I believe we succeeded. Bishop, here we come and the only way we can go is up!


First Aid/CPR Class Offered

Pineapple Angel Food Dump Cake By Vicki Whisler



1 Box Angel Food cake mix

1 20 oz. can crushed pineapple (not drained)

Mix both ingredients together in a bowl until blended, or you can put a liner in your Dutch oven and mix there and save a dirty dish!

Use a 12" Dutch oven. Put 9 briquettes on the lid and 15 briquettes underneath.

Cook approximately 15 - 25 minutes depending on what is going on around you. (Wind, rain, hot day or cold. Everything affects the temperature of the briquettes.)

This is a quick and easy recipe for beginners and pros alike! Enjoy!

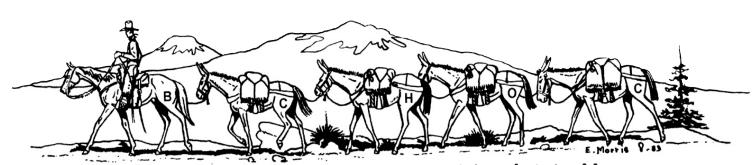
