Riverbank starting at 6:30 p.m.








Thank You For Your Help!

Springtime Checklist

As the weather gets better and we start planning trips to the backcountry, now is the time to prepare. This means giving our horses plenty of time to condition, update the medical requirements and address any hoof issues. Then we can prep all the equipment needed.

Core vaccines are given yearly in the spring, which include Eastern and Western Encephalitis, Tetanus Toxoid, West Nile and Rabies. The risk-based vaccines Influenza and rhinopneumonitis are given twice yearly in the Spring and Fall. There are other vaccines available, such as strangles and the rattlesnake vaccine. Discuss with your veterinarian if these vaccines are warranted in your particular case. Ideally, any vaccine should be given a minimum of two weeks to boost the immune system; so if you give them a day before you leave, your horse probably won't be protected. Deworming should be done at least twice yearly, with fecal exams done between deworming to monitor parasite load and identify those horses who seem to carry a high burden of parasites and need more frequent deworming. Dental exams will help, not only with mastication, but also the comfort level and performance of horses. Sharp points, abnormal wear/chewing, feed packed between teeth and fractured teeth are just some of the issues that can be found and treated with a dental exam. By doing the annual health exam, vaccines and dental, your horse will be ready to start conditioning for the backcountry.

To ensure your horse has just as enjoyable time as you, make sure your equipment is in good shape and fits your horse well. Check for rusty points/edges on the pack boxes, straps and ropes are clean, in good repair, halters aren't frayed and buckets aren't broken. Make sure trailer tires are in good condition, floorboards are strong, no loose partitions or windows in the trailer. Look at it from a horse's perspective to help prevent accidents.

Just in case there is an accident though, make sure to go through your emergency kit. Replace old or expired medications, bandages that are still usable, and anything that was taken out has been replaced (scissors!). You can call Sweet River Equine Clinic for a list of suggested emergency kit items.

Hopefully, by being proactive and going through your checklist now, when it is time to hit the road you will not be delayed by sick animals or equipment failures. When that nice weather is here you will be ready to enjoy the mountains!

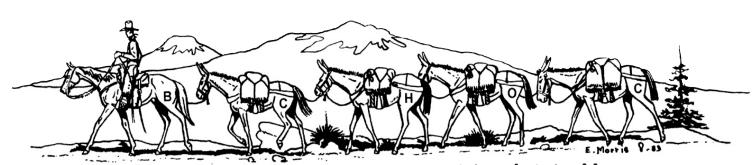
