
If you are able to make it to Bishop this year, make sure to cheer them on!

Cheesy Potatoes

From Rendezvous Competition Submitted by Kathy Zumbrunn

- 1 bag (32 oz.) of cubed frozen hash browns
- 1 medium container of sour cream
- 1 cube of melted butter
- 1 lb. of medium or sharp cheddar cheese
- 1 can of condensed Cream of Celery Soup
- 1/2 of an onion, chopped



Combine all of the above ingredients in a large bowl (withholding a little cheese) and mix well. Place in your DO, then add the withheld cheese to the top. Use foil liners or parchment paper to make cleanup much easier. Heat the potatoes for 1 1/2 hours at 350 degrees. Depending on the size of oven you use and the weather conditions, 350 degrees varies. For a 10-inch oven, use 16 on top and 7 on the bottom. For a 12-inch oven, use 18 on top and 8 on the bottom. This is according to Lodge.

2025 Mid Valley BCHC Spring Campout



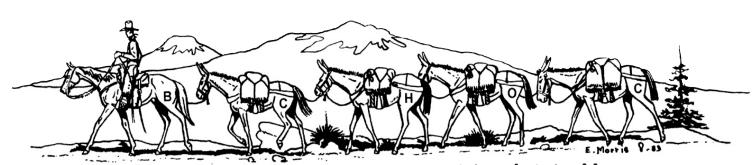
