7 CAN CHICKEN TACO SOUP

Ingredients

- . 1 can (15 ounces) black beans, drained and rinsed
- . 1 can (15 ounces) pinto beans, drained and rinsed
- . 1 can (14.5 ounces) petite diced tomatoes
- . 1 can (15 ounces) sweet corn, drained
- . 1 can (12.5 ounces) chicken breast*, drained & flaked (or about 2½ cups cooked/shredded chicken)
- . 1 can (28 ounces) green enchilada sauce
- . 1 can (14 ounces) chicken broth
- . 1 packet (2 tablespoons) taco seasoning
- . ½ teaspoon cumin
- . ½ teaspoon chili powder
- . ½ teaspoon garlic powder

Topping

- . 1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
- . limes, for garnish
- . tortilla chips, for serving

Instructions

- . Combine all the ingredients into a large pot and bring to a boil over medium-high heat.
- . Lower the heat and let simmer for 20-25 minutes. Serve warm with lime wedges, shredded cheese, and tortilla chips.

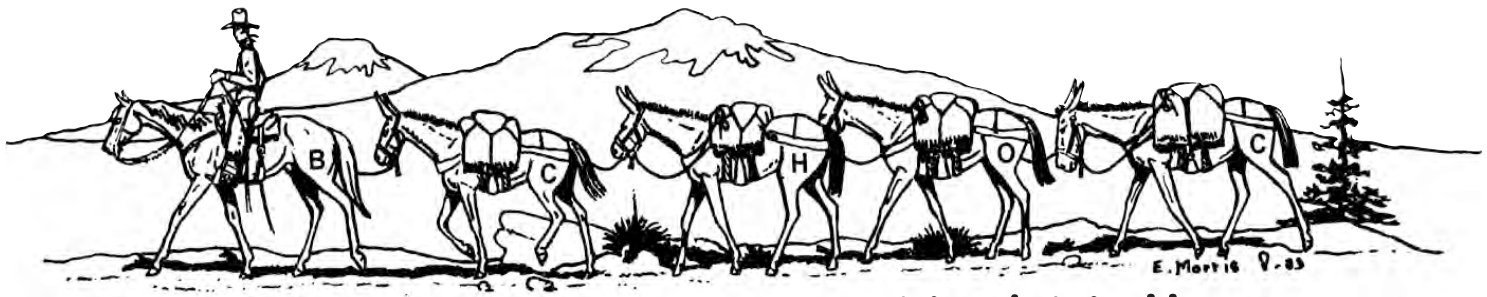
