
Thank you for being part of this wonderful unit and organization. I'm so grateful for each of you and look forward to what lies ahead for our unit this year!



Double Hot Fudge Pudding Cake Recipe

Mix:

1 1/2 cup flour
1/2 tsp salt
2 tsp baking powder

Stir in:
1 cup milk
3 T oil
1 tsp vanilla

Mix, then sprinkle over top:
1 1/2 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup cocoa

3 tsp baking powder

3/4 cup cocoa

Pour 2 1/4 cups hot water over top

Blend in:

1 cup sugar 1 cup chopped nuts

Spread in a 12" Dutch oven, pre-buttered with 1 T butter

Cover and cook for approximately 35-40 minutes using 9-10 coals on bottom and 14-15 coals on top.

Sprinkle chocolate chips on top about 5 minutes before it is finished.

The pudding is done when a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean and the cake feels done to touch. (The pudding will thicken when cooling)




Diamond Bar Play Day

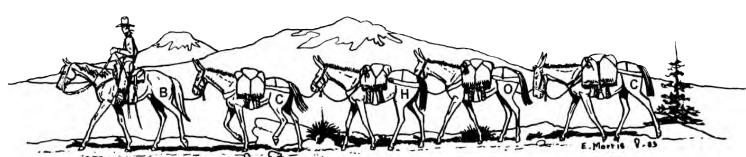
