For February, our annual Valentine's Day ride will be on the 14th at South Comanche



Coconut Bread Pudding

Ingredients:

2 cups milk
2 cups half and half
1 cube butter
2 tablespoons vanilla
1 cup shredded coconut
(Lee uses $\frac{1}{2}$ sweetened, $\frac{1}{2}$ unsweetened)
1 teaspoon cinnamon

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups sugar
3 eggs
1 cup raisins
 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup chopped walnuts
 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon nutmeg
3 $\frac{1}{2}$ slices sourdough bread
(Alfredo's Santa Cruz sourdough Lee prefers)



Cut bread into cubes. Combine all ingredients in a large bowl – let soak 5 minutes. Pour all into a buttered 9 X 13 dish or a 12 in. Dutch oven. Bake at 350 degrees for about 50 minutes until top is a golden brown. (We found this recipe in an old issue of Mid Valley Monthly!)

I want to especially thank Deb and Scott Lewis and Steve and Brenda Bauhr, my co-chairs, for all they do, and extend my heartfelt gratitude to the volunteers who will have to show up very early on Sunday to get this show on the road: Chris Marcus, Joan and Ric Tilbury, Michael King, Lloyd Erlandson and Vicki Morales. Garrett, if you show up with your side by side, I will be thrilled.


